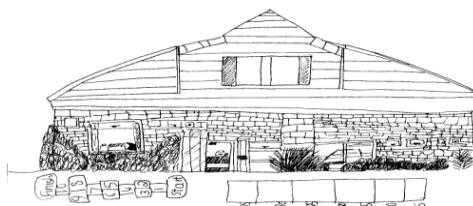

<p>This money supplemented additional funds raised by the school and grants obtained to provide new outdoor equipment to develop physical play and improve levels of physical activity during play times and lunchtimes.</p> <p>SUSTAINABILITY: Pupils now have access to new physical play equipment which is used every lunch time and break time by all pupils in school, embedding physical activity into the school day for all.</p>
