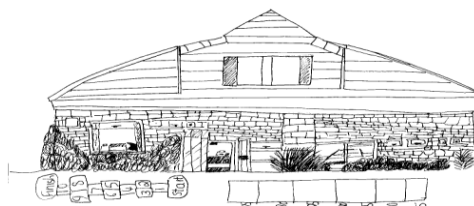

Objectives of Sports Premium 2017/18


- To increase engagement in sporting activities and encourage healthy, active lifestyles by providing opportunities for enrichment sporting activities for all pupils from Reception to Year 6.
- Continue to increase enthusiasm of girls in PE and their uptake in local competition in 2017/18

Following last year's initiative to provide specialist P.E. coaches to upskill teachers and provide exciting and different P.E. opportunities for pupils, £1440 was used from the 2017-18 Sports Premium to pay the final invoice.

Stevenage Sporting Futures	£1500
IMPACT 	
Continued membership of Stevenage Sporting Futures has enabled us to provide: six inter school competition opportunities for children in Key Stage 2; two multi-sport festivals for children in Years 1-4; two intra-school Mini-Olympics events entered by all children from Reception to Y6; and access the Go Girl project, which enabled 12 girls from Y1-6 to participate in a weekly 'Girls Only' sports club for six weeks. We also were able to enter 30 children into the Stevenage Schools Dance Festival.

Sports Apprentice	£5660 +£200 training costs
IMPACT 	
<p>After school clubs: Girls Football; Dance; Cheerleading; and Athletics, run by our Sports Apprentice allowing almost 50 girls to engage in extra-curricular sporting activities.</p> <p>KS1 Girls enrichment cheerleading during the afternoon 1x per week. This was offered in small groups to the KS1 girls (and some 1-to-1) as an opportunity to be out of the classroom and developing their confidence and gross motor skills. All KS1 girls took up this opportunity.</p> <p>SEN support: Working one to one with a KS1 pupil with SEND to develop gross and fine motor skills through PE activities 10 minutes every day. Working one to one with a KS2 pupil with SEND to provide the opportunity to take a break from learning and the classroom for 10 minutes 2-3x a week and play football.</p> <p>PE lesson support: Supporting all teachers in PE lessons by preparing equipment and setting up lessons. Working with individuals and small groups and sharing ideas for warm-ups and other activities learnt as part of her training with teaching staff to enrich lessons.</p> <p>Resources: Keeping on top of the PE shed, resources and updating the subject leader on breakages and when things need replacing.</p> <p>Support on trips/events: Attending all sporting events and trips to support children and adults.</p> <p>Administration: Supporting the Subject Leader by tracking the uptake of extra-curricular activities and competitions. Keeping the Sport Board updated and assisting the Subject Leader with achieving the School Games Bronze Award.</p>

<p>IMPACT</p>  <p>Class 4 football team attended the NH Rural Schools Football Tournament on 28th November (9 pupils) and came in 1st place!</p> <p>Unfortunately, we were unable to attend the Netball Tournament this year due to restrictions on the numbers of boys allowed in a team. This year we only have 2 Y6 girls and 2 Y5 girls who play netball and this was not enough to field a regulation team for the event.</p>

<p>IMPACT</p>  <p>Six days of release time for the subject leader to cover attendance at SFT training, training of the Sports Apprentice and accompanying children to sporting events.</p>	

Initiative 2017/18	
Resources to support the teaching of PE	£1421.67
<p>IMPACT</p>  <p>The following new resources were purchased to support the PE curriculum and enrichment activities</p>	

- £11.99 - corner posts for use by all children in football
- £58.02 – 12 KS1 sized foam balls for ABC lessons
- £284.94 – Assorted foam balls, plastic cones, markers and hurdle bars, tennis balls for PE lessons, ‘bucket’ of tennis balls for lunchtimes
- £330 – Speed Stacks – used by all classes in PE and for enrichment activities
- £103.84 – bibs/vests and carrier nets for balls
- £80.30 – Mini Pop Lacrosse Set
- £136.50 – Ball Pump, 16 netballs, 10 KS1 foam balls
- £3.58 – Resources for whole school Fun Run
- £323.88 – Yoga Mats – used by all children in Yoga sessions during PE
- £75.25 – Giant Mobile Trolley for ball storage

In line with SDP all staff (teaching and support) received training in the delivery of Yoga PE sessions. We were also provided with large posters and books to support teaching. All classes had delivered 1x session of yoga per week as part of their gymnastics lessons or additional yoga activities carried out at the end of PE lessons as a warm-down/reflection time.

Enrichment Opportunities for all Pupils

Each year group has taken part in an enrichment morning or day (depending on location) to engage them in different sporting activities and inspire with an interest in sport and an active lifestyle, as follows:

- Class 1 (Year Reception and Y1) - Horse Riding and Stable Management Session at Courtland’s Riding Stables - £310
- Class 2 (Y1 and Y2) - Horse Riding and Stable Management Session at Courtland’s Riding Stables - £295
- Year 3 – Pedal Up Bike Riding Session and Tour of the Velodrome - £365
- Year 4 – Sailing, Paddle Boarding and Rock Climbing at Fairlands Park - £325
- Year 5 – Kayaking and Water Wipe Out at the Lea Valley Water Park - £630 (double funding allocated intentionally linked to Y6 SATs preparation)
- Year 6 – Paddle sports at Fairlands Park and Bowling £450 (additional funding allocated linked to SATs)

(all above prices are inclusive of transport costs)

From this year, schools are required to publish how many Year 6 pupils have met the national curriculum requirements relating to swimming and water safety.

The National Curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety state that pupils must:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- use a range of strokes effectively
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

At the end of the Academic Year 2017-18:

92% of our Year 6 pupils achieved the National Curriculum Award
