# Class 1 News

It has been delightful to see all the new Receptions settling into life in Class 1. They have done amazingly! In Maths this week, they have been exploring shapes, whilst in Year 1, children have been developing their number skills, with lots of counting games. In English, the children have been practicing their handwriting and beginning to look at autobiographies. All the children have really enjoyed Science, focusing on how to keep healthy and especially learning about healthy diets.

### Class 2 News

In Maths this week, children in Class 2 have been exploring position and movement, looking at left, right, up and down. In English they have been writing sentences about themselves and beginning to look at autobiographies. The children have also enjoyed beginning their 'Movers and Shakers' topic, where they will be finding out all about historically significant individuals.

# Class 3 News

Class 3 have started their exciting topic 'Invasion' this week. Linked to this, in English, they have been reading the re-telling of 'Beowulf' by Rob Lloyd James. They have explored the origins of the story and enjoyed unpicking some of the Olde English language. In Maths, they have explored place value, looking at larger numbers and this afternoon, in Computer Science, they will become Cyber Security experts, writing code in Scratch to find secret numbers and learning about the importance of having strong passwords.

#### Class 4 News

This week, Class 4 completed their letters of condolence to the Royal Family, following the sad death of Queen Elizabeth II. They also explored the correct tense, person and vocabulary used in newspaper reports. In Maths, the children have been learning to count on, and back, in powers of 10 and revising rounding. They have also been excited to begin their Maafa topic and have been learning all about the kingdoms and empires in the continent of Africa.
