Class News

Hedgehog Class

This half term Hedgehog Class have been enjoying learning all about Kings and Queens and castles. Reception have learnt about what life was like in the past before televisions, the Internet and toilets in houses! We were lucky enough to have Stevenage Museum come into school to run a workshop called 'Peep into the Past' where we got the chance to play with old toys and dress up in clothes from the past. Year 1 have learnt about six significant monarchs and how to put them in chronological order on a timeline. In Science, we have started to learn about mini beasts and how to classify animals. In P.S.H.E. we have been thinking about relationships and how to be a good friend. In Computing, Year 1 have started to learn how to use a word processor and Receptions have explored using paint programs for Art and programming beebots.

Squirrel Class

This half term we have started out new topic Magnificent Monarchs. We have learnt about different British Monarchs through history and thought about how powerful they were. In Science we have been learning about micro habitats where we focused on the pond and creatures and plants that live there. During R.E. we have focused on Judaism where we learnt about Moses, the Torah, the Ten Commandments and Shabbat. In P.E. we have developed our ball skills and used these to play a variety of games including cricket and bench ball. In English, our book focus was 'The Dragon Machine' and 'Pug the Pig' where we have developed our skills on conjunctions, prefixes and extending sentences. We have also been developing our extended writing skills by writing longer narratives. In Maths we have focused on our multiplication skills and how we can use these in different contexts to solve a range of problems.

Foxes Class

This half term has been a busy one in Foxes. In English, we have explored the text 'Flotsam' and the children have created their own fantastic sequels called 'Jetsam' incorporating all the features we have been learning about. Their published books have been on display and it has been lovely to see how proud they are of their work. In Maths, we have recently been focusing on formal methods of multiplication. We have also looked at statistics, area and perimeter this term. As part of our History learning we studied Ancient Sumer. We have learnt about civilisations, inventions, hierarchy, farming and Sargon the Great. In PSHE we have looked at relationships discussing stereotypes, equality and Fairtrade as well as discussing strategies to help resolve conflicts. Audio production has been our focus in Computing and the children have made a start to put together their section for a class podcast - we will be working on this next half term.

Badger Class

This half term, Badger Class has enjoyed learning about abstract art, specifically 'orphanism' and how artists use simple line, shape and brilliant colours to replicate complex images - this was a tricky concept as there were many discussions about it was 'real art' or not because it was not realistic. We have also begun our 'Britain at War' History topic, looking at poetry of the time, Anne Frank and the factors and events that led to World War 1 beginning. In Science, we have learn all about how light travels as well as how the eye sees colour (handy for our Art lessons) and in French, learn how to order food and drink in a cafè - many are looking forward to using their skills when they go to Paris (apparently). In R.E. we have explored Buddhism, lots of children felt it is a very peaceful religion. In P.S.H.E. we have focused on online relationships - how to stay safe with friends online and how to know what to do if there are any friendship issues through social media or games played on online platforms.
