#### FOG news

## Class News

#### **Hedgehog Class**

This half term in Hedgehogs has been very busy with lots of learning. In Maths, the children have been exploring place value within 20, addition within 20, number bonds and odd and even numbers. In English, we have been looking at the story called 'Stanley's Stick'. We looked at prediction, sequencing the story, writing sentences and spotting verbs. P.S.H.E. has allowed the children to reflect on the successes and challenges they have faced so far. The children have really enjoyed Geography this half term (focus on human and physical features) and looked at what they could find when exploring on Google Maps. In Science, the children have been learning about the weather, rainfall and all about evergreen and deciduous trees. In Computing, the children have been learning how to group different objects based on size, shape and colour and we have then been able to collate this information. In Music, they have been exploring beat, sound, instruments and signing 'The Dragon Song'. For Art, they have looked at collagraphs and in R.E., EYFS children have explored Ramadan and The Easter Story whilst Year 1s have been understanding the importance of Jesus, Guru Nanak and Krishna to some people.

#### **Squirrel Class**

We have had another busy half term in Squirrels. In English, we have worked on our story writing skills using the books, 'Tadpole's Promise' and 'Beegu'. We have also worked on developing our vocabulary. In Maths, we have started working on our 2,5 and 10 x tables. We have learnt all about seasons and the weather in Science and have loved exploring London and Kuala Lumpa in Geography. Thank you once again for all your support and we look forward to our new learning after half term.

#### **Foxes Class**

This half term in Foxes Class, we have been using the books, 'Winter's Child' and 'The Last Garden' to develop our writing skills. We have worked on adjectives, tenses, conjunctions and dialogue along with developing a range of writing techniques to suit the audience we are writing for. The children created beautiful sequels to the 'Winter's Child', called 'Spring's Child'. It was lovely to see how proud they were of their finished books. Maths this term has had a strong focus on multiplication. We have worked hard on our times tables and related division facts. In Geography, we have been learning all about rocks, tectonic plates and volcanoes. In Art, we have used our knowledge of contrasting colours to create some vibrant volcano artwork. Using ammonites as inspiration, we have created and printed a motif, based on the Fibonacci pattern.

#### **Badger Class**

In Badger Class, we have started our topic called 'Sow, Grow and Farm', looking at different types of farming, as well as researching, planning and beginning to create our own allotments on the school grounds. Our book study this half term has been 'The Secret Garden' and the pupils have enjoyed exploring Mary Lennox as a tyrannical six-year old child on her journey to become more affectionate. In Maths, we have mainly focused on all things fractions - simplifying; finding equivalent fractions; adding; subtracting; multiplying; dividing and finding fractions of amounts. In Science, we have been focusing on flowering plants as well as asexual plant reproduction (to help us with our allotments), and comparing life cycles of insects, reptiles, amphibians, mammals and birds. In English, we have explored the 'Three Little Pigs' story through the media of a Guardian newspaper advert and created a discussion text on 'Is it ever ok to commit a crime?' using the three little pigs 'getting rid of' the wolf as a starting point. We have also begun to look at 'High Rise Mysteries' and the children are part-way through exploring how to write their own detective story. We are very much looking forward to continuing this topic next half term.

#### World Book Day 2024

This year, World Book Day takes place on Thursday 7 March, and we hope you'll join us as we come together to celebrate our World Book Day at Graveley. The theme for this year's world book day is Read Your Way! Every year on World Book Day, we are overwhelmed by the enthusiasm of our school community.

We are however aware of the cost of living and we do not want our celebrations to be an additional burden. Therefore, as the theme is 'Read Your Way', we would like the children to come into school dressed in an outfit which they would feel comfortable to enjoy reading in – this may be their pyjamas or a football kit! (You are not obliged to buy a new fancy dress outfit.)

We will also be running a competition for you to take part in before the day: Create a wooden spoon book character! There are many different ways you could create a book character from the wooden spoon, so this is a chance to get creative! Below are some examples of these:



Please bring in your creations on World Book Day and we will look at and admire these in the assembly first thing in the morning. There will be book-related prizes for those which are judged as winners: one in EYFS and Key Stage 1 and one in Key Stage 2.
